

# Fairfax County Climate Goals

# **Community-wide (CECAP)**

- Carbon neutrality by 2050
- 75% reduction in carbon emissions by 2040
- 50% reduction in carbon emissions by 2030




### **County Operations (OES)\***

- Adaptive Environments



#### Average Temperatures by Year






# Wetter

Fairfax County, VA, 1996-2024






# Weirder

# Legislation

### **Fairfax County Legislative Program**

- Ensures the county has the authority and funding needed to implement local policies and priorities
- Public process began September


### **Legislation last General Assembly Session:**

- 3,107 bills and resolutions introduced
  - ~ **150 bills** were environmental
  - ~ 50 environmental bills passed the GA, although many were vetoed by the Governor

### **FYI on Passed Legislation:**

- <u>Passed, enacted: HB2266/SB1058</u>: Electric utilities; distribution cost sharing program established, etc.
- <u>Passed, enacted: HB1819</u>: C-PACE; changes to financing program, definitions
- <u>Passed: enacted: HB2630</u>: Trees; replacement during development process in localities, tree canopy fund
- <u>Passed, enacted: HJ434</u>: JLARC study; Non-federal sponsor contributions by localities to conduct CSRM studies
- Passed: enacted: HJ437: Reestablishes Joint Subcommittee on Recurrent Flooding
- <u>Passed: enacted HB2034</u>: Policy task force: restoration of tidal and nontidal wetlands



# Progress on Facilities' Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy










County gov. are only **2.5% of emissions** in Fairfax County; however, the county is **leading by example. Overall goal of energy carbon neutrality by 2040.**

### Cumulative Annual Energy Reductions Implemented (MMBtu/yr) – ESPC Projects






Reston Community Center Heating System Upgrade




